## CONSTRUCTION OF FIRING LINE COVER FOR RIFLE RANGE TO BEGIN

The long planned construction of a firing line cover for the rifle range is to begin this summer.

Eventually there will be covered sections for the 25, 50, 100 and 200 yard sections.

This year, the section in front of the 100 yard berm will be built. An area 40 ft long by 16 ft deep will be covered.

## RIFLE RANGE USERS ASKED TO USE CARE IN MOUNTING TARGETS

In order to reduce the work and costs for target holders, users of the rifle range are asked not to shoot at the posts used to hold up the target mounting boards. Also, mount targets away from the posts to minimize hits on them. They can be located by a quick look over the top of the mounting boards.
